21: ¹⁰When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" ¹¹The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee." ¹²Then Jesus entered the temple and drove out all who were selling and buying in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves. ¹³He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer'; but you are making it a den of robbers." ¹⁴The blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he cured them. ¹⁵But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the amazing things that he did, and heard the children crying out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they became angry.

23: ³⁷ Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! ³⁸See, your house is left to you, desolate. ³⁹For I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.'"

Leviticus 19:9-18, 33-34 (NRSV)

⁹When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. ¹⁰You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Lord your God. ¹¹You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. ¹²And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Lord. ¹³You shall not defraud your neighbor; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a laborer until morning. ¹⁴You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind; you shall fear your God: I am the Lord. ¹⁵You shall not render an unjust judgment; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbor. ¹⁶You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbor: I am the Lord, ¹⁷You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbor, or you will incur guilt yourself. ¹⁸You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord. ... ³³When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. ³⁴The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.

Mateo 21:10-15, 23:37-39 (RVR1995)

21: ¹⁰ Cuando entró él en Jerusalén, toda la ciudad se agitó, diciendo: —¿Quién es éste? ¹¹ Y la gente decía: —Éste es Jesús, el profeta, el de Nazaret de Galilea. ¹² Entró Jesús en el templo de Dios y echó fuera a todos los que vendían y compraban en el Templo; volcó las mesas de los cambistas y las sillas de los que vendían palomas, ¹³ y les dijo: «Escrito está: "Mi casa, casa de oración será llamada", pero vosotros la habéis hecho cueva de ladrones.» ¹⁴ Y en el Templo se le acercaron ciegos y cojos, y los sanó. ¹⁵ Pero los principales sacerdotes y los escribas, viendo las maravillas que hacía y a los muchachos aclamando en el Templo y diciendo: «iHosana al Hijo de David!», se enojaron.

Levítico 19:9-18, 33-34 (RVR1995)

⁹ »Cuando siegues la mies de tu tierra, no segarás hasta el último rincón de ella ni espigarás tu tierra segada. ¹⁰ No rebuscarás tu viña ni recogerás el fruto caído de tu viña; para el pobre y para el extranjero lo dejarás. Yo, Jehová, vuestro Dios.¹¹ »No robaréis, no mentiréis ni os engañaréis el uno al otro.¹² »No juraréis en falso por mi nombre, profanando así el nombre de tu Dios. Yo, Jehová. ¹³ »No oprimirás a tu prójimo ni le robarás. »No retendrás el salario del jornalero en tu casa hasta la mañana siguiente. ¹⁴ »No maldecirás al sordo, ni delante del ciego pondrás tropiezo, sino que tendrás temor de tu Dios. Yo, Jehová.¹⁵ »No cometerás injusticia en los juicios, ni favoreciendo al pobre ni complaciendo al grande: con justicia juzgarás a tu próiimo. ¹⁶ »No andarás chismeando entre tu pueblo. »No atentarás contra la vida de tu prójimo. Yo, Jehová. ¹⁷ »No aborrecerás a tu hermano en tu corazón. »Reprenderás a tu prójimo, para que no participes de su pecado. ¹⁸ »No te vengarás ni guardarás rencor a los hijos de tu pueblo, sino amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Yo, Jehová. . . . ³³ »Cuando el extranjero habite con vosotros en vuestra tierra, no lo oprimiréis.³⁴ Como a uno de vosotros trataréis al extranjero que habite entre vosotros, y lo amarás como a ti mismo, porque extranjeros fuisteis en la tierra de Egipto. Yo, Jehová, vuestro Dios.
